Briefly state the purpose and goals of this project or program. *

Boys & Girls Clubs of the River Region (BGCRR) "provide programs and opportunities which encourage young people, especially those who need us most, to maximize their potential and become caring and productive citizens of our community."

The challenges of discipline, reasoning, and problem solving inherent in The Arts are especially effective in building self-confidence and self-esteem in young people. Many educators believe that children unexposed to art are as lacking as children without math. Yet arts programs are disappearing from the lives of many young people as schools struggle with budget cuts in their attempts to sustain and maintain a viable arts program. This is why BGCRR is seeking continued funding for operation of Arts programs at its clubs West End, and Chisholm. This funding has and will continue to contribute significantly to the positive, overall development of club members.

Briefly describe your plans for administration of this project or program request? *

BGCRR is a place where young people can come to receive guidance in the arts from trained professional staff and where they develop the self-esteem needed to become leaders of their community. Our staff for this project consists of the Arts & Crafts Directors, who administer the arts & crafts program, and report to the Unit Directors, who report to and work closely with our Central Service Office staff will carry out other administrative requirements. This team will oversee all activities for the youth.

How will you evaluate the success of this project or program? Or how have you evaluated the * success of this project or program in the past?

BGCRR has designed Pre- & post-program surveys which are completed by our club members. Examples of some of the questions asked are:

- 1. My knowledge of ways to create arts and crafts
- 2. My knowledge of different artists.
- 3. My interest and participation in arts/crafts activities.
- 4. My knowledge of different music styles and artists.
- 5. My knowledge of arts resources in the community.

The program score is measured on a sale of 1-4, with 1 or (poor) being the lowest score and 4 or (excellent) being the highest score. The program score from all our clubs showed an average of 2.87 on pre- program surveys and 3.20 on post- program surveys...this is a 17% positive change for 2016. This is proof that we're having a greater impact on our youth in the areas of The Arts for which they have a greater appreciation and understanding.

BGCRR uses membership, club attendance, and activity attendance to determine the ongoing need for and demand of the facility and its offerings. Monthly reports on attendance – both at the club and for each of the hundreds of activities offered each month are prepared by the administrative staff and shared with the Board of Directors at each month's meeting
