Briefly state the purpose and goals of this project or program. *

The purpose of the funding is to purchase technology and equipment such as a Mimio Teach Bar with a Myfi so that schools without smart boards and limited wifi can interactive training sessions. The Myfi allows for hotspot capability where wifi is limited. This technology would allow staff working with special education high school students in rural areas to access interactive career exploration and job development training. The goal is to prepare special ed students for the world of work as they transition out of high school. This technology will allow staff to work with students that have limited internet access and interactive computers.

Briefly describe your plans for administration of this project or program request? *

The equipment and internet access will be used by our workforce development staff at Easterseals Central Alabama (ECA). Each of the job development specialists have a caseload which includes transition students (special ed students graduating high school). The workforce development staff have developed a training menu for transition students which include: How to be a good employee; Job exploration tours of local industry/businesses; S.O.A.R. which is a series that covers detailed information about job searching, career opportunities, types of local jobs, and job openings; Smart Work Ethics; topics on logical reasoning and assessing situations; conflict and anger management; customer service; career assessments; and actual paid work experiences to gain real life experience. These are just a few of what ECA staff can offer high school students. Most of these services are offered in the school. Being able to bring along state of the art technology with internet access ensures that students are provided an interactive and engaging presentation allowing them to participate in the learning experience. Some of the schools in outlying areas have spotty internet service and most schools lack smart boards. The technology purchased would allow staff to bring it with them to the schools. Providing opportunities for students to receive career exploration and training on soft skills prepares these students before they actually graduate and gets them accustomed to work. A lot of these kids are capable of preparing for good paying jobs. It's a matter of preparing them and equipping them to meet the challenges of the job market.

How will you evaluate the success of this project or program? Or how have you evaluated the * success of this project or program in the past?

Each training offered to students has a post-test to assess what the students learn. Also, those students participating in trainings also participate in a summer work program where they can demonstrate they are job ready.
