The mission of FSC is to end family violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking; to foster hope and healing; to offer immediate response and a safe-haven in crisis; to provide advocacy, counseling, and support for victims; to empower them to lead safe, violence-free lives; and to promote community awareness through education and training.

This project will further efforts by aiding in the provision of direct services to victims of violence seeking refuge in shelter. The project will assist residents of Montgomery County, as well as Autauga, Butler, Chilton, Crenshaw, Elmore and Lowndes counties. \$50,000 in local funding will help secure \$200,000 in federal funding for the provision of these services.
