MACOA sponsors the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP)

for Autauga, Coosa, Elmore, Montgomery and Tallapoosa Counties. The purpose of RSVP is to link the skills, knowledge, and experience of a senior volunteer

with identified critical needs in the community, and to provide rewarding opportunities for seniors. RSVP recruits volunteers for eight areas of service: Healthy Futures, Veterans and Military Families, Education, Environmental Stewardship, Community Priorities, Economic Opportunity, Donations Management, and Disaster Services. In our five counties 55% of our volunteers serve in the primary focus area Healthy Futures. These volunteers deliver Meals on Wheels, prepare and package frozen meals, provide respite to caregivers, serve in food banks and food pantries, and provide transportation and companionship to homebound individuals.


As an RSVP volunteer, individuals share their knowledge and skills learned in their lifetimes and have the satisfaction of knowing they are making a difference in the lives of others.


