Briefly state the purpose and goals of this project or program. *

The Davis Elementary, Nixon Elementary and Bellingrath conversion charter schools are part of a plan to serve much of the feeder pattern in West Montgomery, providing a transformative educational opportunity to improve our public schools. The first in the state of Alabama, the conversion charter model continues to serve the students in the enrollment zone but reconstitutes the leadership, instruction, and student support models. In fall of 2021, Davis Elementary started the school year as a conversion charter school, led by Phalen Leadership Academies and the Montgomery Education Foundation.

Nixon Elementary and Bellingrath Middle School will convert in the Fall of 2022, creating a continuum of high quality and high expectations for families and over 1500 students.

All 3 of these schools are among the lowest performing schools in the district and the state. We know that the past performance scores are not indicative of the students abilities and are working to change outcomes with new leadership and instructional focus.

These schools are still a part of the MPS system, but have the autonomy of new management.

At risk students are at particular risk for significant learning loss during the summer that increases the challenge of success during the school year.

MEF has developed and successfully implemented the Brain Forest and LEAPS summer academic enrichment programs to address this learning loss which also includes the MGM READS literacy/reading program.

PURPOSE:

To reduce summer learning loss for public school students by providing access to high quality summer academic enrichment programs.

GOALS:

- 1. Serve 300 conversion school students grades K-6 during the summer of 2023
- 2. Create access to reading libraries for children during the summer providing weekly book packages for each child for 5 weeks.
- 3. Increase proficiency in reading and math

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The MEF Program Director will manage the implementation of the program.

MPS teachers and pre-service teachers from Schools of Education will be competitively hired to provide daily instruction. A summer assistant will be hired to manage the MGM Reads program and manage the weekly delivery of book packages to students.

How will you evaluate the success of this project or program? Or how have you evaluated the * success of this project or program in the past?

Pre and post tests will be administered to all students in the academic enrichment program. The MGM Reads program will quantify the number of books/packages delivered as well as be able to measure the number of minutes each student reads during the summer through the online library that is included. We will also be able to follow those students through the school year to measure any gains versus other students who did not participate.
